Thomas Jefferson and his wife Martha inherited the Bedford County plantation known as Poplar Forest from her father in 1773. The property's name, which predates Jefferson's ownership, reflects the forest that once grew here. Several stately poplars in front of the home welcome visitors today.

The weather for the event could not have been better, midseventies and sunny. CVC members drove from the Richmond area to Forest Virginia to meet-up with the SWVA members at the Sheetz store on US 460 in Forest. From the Sheetz store, we went on to Poplar Forest.


For our November 2013 meet, CVC/SDC will take the Tour of Henricus Historical Park.

Studebaker in Richmond

When Isaac S. Tower unexpectedly died on January 30, 1892, he left his Studebaker Agency and farming implements business in limbo.

Mr. Charles E. Hunter was a friend and business associate who was a honorary pallbearer at Mr. Tower's funeral and administrator of his estate.

Mr. Hunter was a successful businessman who lived in Fredericksburg, Virginia. He was the manufacturer of the "Farmers Friend" plow and was also in the farming implements business. He had business interest in Fredericksburg, Richmond and Petersburg Virginia.


The Studebaker Agency and other business interest of Mr. Tower located at 1528 East Main Street were acquired by Mr. Hunter from the estate along with other property. Mr. Hunter continued selling Studebaker wagons from this location.

In April of 1900, Mr. Hunter announced plans to build a new warehouse on East Main Street to expand the business. However, on Wednesday, May 30, 1900, he was found dead from a heart attack in his room at the Lexington Hotel located at 12th and East Main Streets by a chambermaid.

With the death of Mr. Hunter, the plans for the expansion never occurred and the business continued to operate at the 1528 East Main Street location as Charles E. Hunter for several more years.




1528 East Main Street, Richmond, Virginia today

CVC Members Out-N-About

Jim Jett visited the St. Louis Museum of Transportation in St. Louis, Missouri, while in the area on business.

The museum has examples of rail, water, air and land transportation with a focus on the St. Louis area. This included automobiles made in St. Louis by the St. Louis Motor Carriage Company and the Dorris Motor Car Company.

There are 2 unique automobiles at the museum, a 1963 Chrysler Turbine and Bobby Darin's 1960 DiDia 150 custom built "Dream Car".

The Chrysler Turbine is the only one currently in private hands and is fully operational. It is started by the owner every 2 weeks.

Bobby Darin donated his 1960 DiDia 150 to the museum in 1970 after driving it and using it for promotions and other entertainment purposes.

Although the collection is "obviously incomplete" since it has no Studebaker, it does have a related marque. They have a 1912 Pierce-Arrow motorcycle.

Overall it was well worth the visit.
