We started our tour in the Maymont Carriage House with a guided tour of the collection of carriages. The collection ranged from large transport carriages, to sleighs, to miniature wagons.

As Studebaker fans, we were all interested in seeing the Studebaker Bailey buggy. It is a lightweight vehicle with wire spoke wheels and pneumatic tires.

From the carriage house we went to visit the Dooley Mansion. Completed in 1893, the 33 room house shows how well the "upper crust" lived at the turn of the 20th century. Our guide provided an informative look at the Dooley's and their home.

From Maymont, we journeyed south of the James River via the "Nickle" Bridge, which cost us 35 cents, to have a late lunch at O'Tooles Restaurant on Forest Hill Avenue.

The group then disbursed to enjoy a beautiful Saturday afternoon.

The Central Virginia Chapter will visit the Pamplin Historical The annual Greater Virginia Chapter Car and Truck Show will Park for the November meet.

Located on the site of the April 2, 1865 "Breakthrough", the battle that ended the Petersburg Campaign and led to the evacuation of the Confederate capital at Richmond, the Park's 424 acres include four award-winning museums, four antebellum homes, living history venues, and shopping facilities.

We will gather at the museum and have a guided tour including the Tudor Hall Plantation.

The house, built circa 1812, has been carefully restored to its wartime appearance and furnished with period antiques. The house was home to the Boisseau family, ancestors of the Pamplins, and during the Civil War was used as the headquarters of Confederate General Samuel McGowan.

Tudor Hall's furnishings reflect both its civilian and military history. The west side of the house is furnished as the Boisseau family would have known it. The east side of the house is outfitted to suit the needs of a Confederate general and his staff. In the English basement, a display entitled "A Land Worth Fighting For," explores the Southern agrarian way of life as well as the history of Tudor Hall Plantation.

Central Virginia Chapter, Greater Virginia Chapter and the Southwest Virginia Chapter got together on September 13th, 2014, for a Virginia statewide celebration of International Drive Your Studebaker Day. Studebakers from north, south, east and west were on the civil war trail to converge on Appomattox, Virginia.

The day started with clouds and some rain as we made the journey, but, cleared after we all met in Appomattox. CVC member Don Jones organized the tour and served as our "private" tour guide.

Our first stop on the trail was a visit to the Appomattox Court House National Historic Park where General Robert E. Lee surrendered the Army of Northern Virginia to General Ulysses S. Grant.

The group visited the court house and viewed the exhibits there. We then went to the Clover Hill Tavern for a living history presentation. Next we toured the village which included the McLean House where Lee and Grant met and signed the surrender documents. From the National Historic Park, we caravanned to the Museum of the Confederacy at Appomattox. The Museum of the Confederacy at Appomattox is a branch of the Museum located in Richmond, Virginia.

Upon arrival, putting first things first, we all parked our Studebakers in front of the museum and gathered for a group picture at the entrance. After the pictures of the group and our cars, we toured the museum exhibits.

When we completed the museum tour, we all got back into our Studebakers and traveled to the Babcock House Bed & Breakfast and Restaurant. There we had an excellent buffet where no one left hungry!

After the meal, with the sun shining, we got back on the trail to return to our homes.


